<p>James Brindley School attracts Primary PE & Sports Premium Grant for the KS2 pupils based at the Dovedale Centre.</p>	<p>The grant allocated to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE that is on offer. James Brindley has identified keys areas for development;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introducing pupils to new sporting activities • Increasing the availability of sporting activities • Promoting sporting activities to the Primary cohort • Allowing pupils to find and progress in sporting activities they enjoy • Improving the facilities available during break times • Upskilling instructors to work with current and future cohorts • Encouraging participation in whole school sporting events

James Brindley School has planned initiatives in each of these areas;</p>	<p>Key Indicators:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school • The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement • Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport • Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils • Increased participation in competitive sport

<p>Review</p>	<p>Whilst planning our strategy for the Primary Sports Premium we wanted to ensure we had exceptional impact and make significant, long lasting changes that would ensure pupils had access to high quality physical activities.</p> <p>Within our current provision we have;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Developed outside space to provide some access to recreational sports such as climbing. • Develop opportunities to enjoy sport during break and lunch time with the introduction of basketball hoops. • Establish a storage area for Sports equipment to ensure they are maintained and if a fit state for use. • Established extra-curricular provision to include access to additional physical activities and sports including karate. • Met expectations of the primary curriculum for Physical Education.
<p>Strategy</p>	<p>In 2021/2022 we aim to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop our outdoor learning space to provide access to physical activities and competitive sports. • Develop opportunities to access a broader range of sports and physical activities. • Develop staff CPD opportunities to have the skills and knowledge to deliver high quality physical activities.
<p>Proposed Impact</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 100% of primary pupils have increased access to an engaging space to be physical. • 100% of primary pupils have the opportunity to take part in a new physical activity. • 100% of primary pupils have at least 30 minutes of physical activity during their school day. • All staff that teach primary pupils receive CPD that improves their pedagogy when teaching Physical Education.
